Enactment of this bill could result in reduced ongoing General Fund revenue of \$500 from the no longer assessing fines and criminal surcharge fees beginning in FY 2027. This could also result in a \$1,200 ongoing revenue decrease to Court Security beginning in FY 2027.

Local Government

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this bill could result in an ongoing fine revenue decrease by an estimated \$2,100 beginning in FY 2027. Local government entities could experience the following estimated expenditure impacts beginning in FY 2027: 1. Prosecutors - \$5,800 decrease; 2. Local Justice Court - unknown decrease.

Individuals & Businesses

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Individuals no longer cited for violations could save up to \$120 per case for an aggregated savings of \$3,800 in fines and surcharge fees beginning in FY 2027.

Regulatory Impact

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this legislation likely will not change the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.

This bill does not create a new program or significantly expand an existing program.

Notes on Notes

Fiscal explanations estimate the direct costs or revenues of enacting a bill. The Legislature uses them to balance the budget. They do not measure a bill's benefits or non-fiscal impacts like opportunity costs, wait times, or inconvenience. A fiscal explanation is not an appropriation. The Legislature decides appropriations separately.
